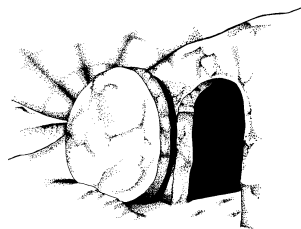

NOISY BUCKETS FOR CHANGE—When you dig deep into your pockets for some loose change, it's amazing what you can come up with! 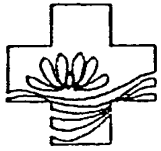

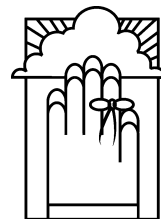

THRIVENT CONGREGATIONAL TEAM NEWS

Thrivent Builds with Habitat for

Humanity 2012—Our partner family, the Finleys, visited our congregation on March 11 and were the guests of honor at our Thrivent Team Luncheon. They wish to thank us for the hospitality and support of the Habitat house we are building for them.

The Lutheran Habitat House build began March 13, and with the good weather and many volunteers, we are about 5 days ahead of schedule. By the time you read this, it will be completely shelled in. Volunteers are still needed so see the schedule posted on the Sign-Up Central bulletin board. At least 50% of the volunteers must be Lutherans and 25% must be Thrivent members from our local Chapter.

On March 16 we had a successful Wall Raising Ceremony with 76 people in attendance. Nathan Mueller helped present a symbolic check in the amount of \$89,000, representing the gifts of the Chapter congregations and Thrivent Financial for Lutherans via Thrivent Builds. This amount covers 65% of the cost of the build.

St. Mark's needs about \$500 to complete our pledge for this build. If you wish to donate, make your checks out to **THRIVENT BUILDS** and write St. Mark's on the memo line. Place your check in the collection plate. All contributions are tax deductible. If you have any questions, please contact Ed Hauser, at 236-1992.

On April 14, St. Mark's is responsible for providing lunch for a group of 15 volunteers and staff. There is a sign-up sheet for members to provide sandwiches, fruit, snacks, cookies, and drinks. Remember that if you help supply and deliver a lunch to the site, we receive a ½ day volunteer credit for that activity. Perhaps a St. Mark's group or Team could adopt this as an activity project.

An important date coming up:

APRIL 28 - WOMEN'S BUILD DAY: All women are invited to participate. Bring your own lunch. Women can also sign up for any other days to work.

Lutherock Work Week—From April 30 - May 3, our Thrivent Chapter, Congregational Team, and Lutheran Men in Mission will be completing a variety of work projects at Lutherock. A \$1,600 grant has been received from the Thrivent Central Blue Ridge Chapter, St. Mark's LMM is contributing \$500, and the Christian Action and Thrivent Congregational Teams have allocated \$500 Thrivent Choice Dollars for materials needed for this project.

Lodging is free, but you must bring bed linens, blankets and your own wash cloths and towels. We will leave the church parking lot at 8:30am Monday and return Thursday evening. We will share the cost of meals. Bring a sack lunch for the first day. We will do some spring wild flower walks in the evenings. There is a sign-up sheet on the Sign-Up Central bulletin board. Contact Ed Hauser (236-1992) if you have any questions.

Thrivent Outreach Dollars—At a recent LMM meeting, the following questions were raised: Where do the dollars come from that are used for Thrivent Builds grants, Chapter allocated dollars, and Thrivent Choice Dollars? Am I losing dividends and some of my investments for these outreach projects?

The answer for the last question is no! Thrivent Financial for Lutherans is a Fortune 500 not-for-profit company. As a result, monies that would have gone to pay state and federal taxes are placed into a pool of funds made available through the above mentioned programs. 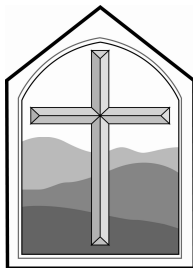
