Catherine Winkworth (13 September 1827 – 1 July 1878)




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Today the church remembers the life and witness of Catherine Winkworth. Catherine was born near London in 1827, and studied under eminent Unitarians of her day. While spending time in Germany she became interested in the chorale tradition (the hymns of Martin Luther and others), and published her first collection of translations in 1854, to be followed by at least three further volumes. Lutherans who worship in the English language are particularly indebted to Catherine Winkworth for her masterful work, which not only allows the great texts of the Reformation and subsequent centuries to be sung to their original melodies, but also conveys the precise meanings of those texts with astonishing clarity. Our hymnal includes 18 (!) of her texts, and her works appear in all major denominational hymanls. Winkworth was also a tireless advocate of women's education, serving as secretary of the Clifton Association for Higher Education for Women, a supporter of the Clifton High School for Girls, where a school house is named after her, and governor of the Red Maids' School in Westbury-on-Trym in the city of Bristol. She died one hundred and forty two years ago today; a monument was erected in her honor at Bristol Cathedral. This evening we will sing two of her works, "Dearest Jesus, At Your Word," and "Lord, Thee I Love With All My Heart."




Reading





For those who travel, for those who are sick and suffering, and for those who are in captivity, let us | pray to the Lord. **Lord, have mercy.**


For deliverance in the time of affliction, wrath, danger, and need, let us | pray to the Lord. **Lord, have mercy.**


