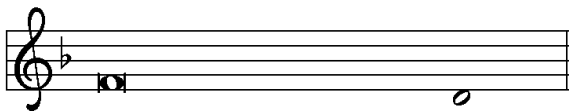
Hear my prayer, O Lord; **listen to my cry.**



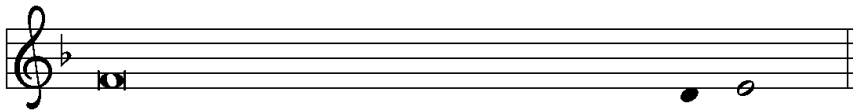
