# Welcome to St. Mark's!

We're glad you are here. Please sign the **pew pad** at the end of your pew so we may greet you by name.

**Children** are important members of our community, and are welcome and encouraged to be in worship. Activity bags and books for children to use during the service are available in the Commons (directly outside the Sanctuary). Changing tables are located in the restrooms off the Commons.

We believe Christ is the host of **Holy Communion**, and that it is a feast for all the baptized. All those seeking the true presence of Jesus in, with, and under bread and wine are welcome at the table. Communion is received at the head of the aisle. The wine is red, and the juice is white. Those who are not baptized or do not wish to receive are invited to come forward for a blessing.

This **bulletin** is reused for three weeks. The hymns are listed by date, and are in the red hymnal. The readings and psalms are listed on pages 14-16; the readings are in the black pew bibles. Please return this bulletin to an usher at the end of the service.

The sanctuary is equipped with a **T-coil Loop** system to assist people with hearing difficulties. Headsets for those without T-coil equipped hearing aids are available from ushers upon request.




## Proper Preface

Take and eat; this is my body, given for you.

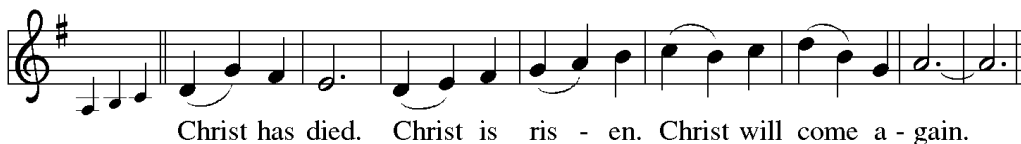
Do this for the remembrance of me.

This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin.

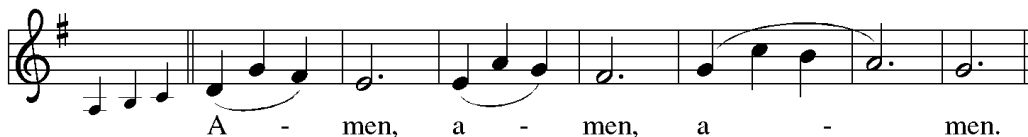
Do this for the remembrance of me.

**now and forever. Amen.**



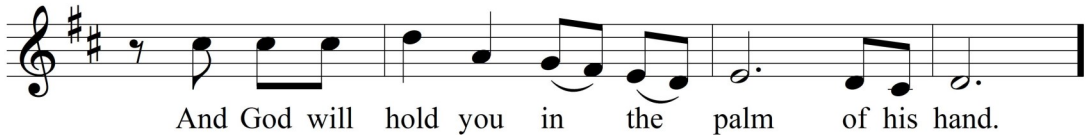
