Our Advent Wait



We love instant gratification. Can't remember that actor's name? Have an argument about the words to a song? With the internet at our fingertips, there's no need to wait! And so we have become accustomed to getting what we want, when we want it. "What? Shipping is going to take how long?" If I can't have it now, I might not even want it anymore. And if you want to see me really frustrated, let's talk about how long I had to wait in line just to turn in an old license plate at the tag and title office. Seriously, you're going to waste my time on that? Who wants to wait when we could be moving on to the next thing?

But all waiting is not the same. If I'm stuck in a waiting room because my dentist is running behind or the plane is delayed, well sure, that's a run out the clock, twiddle the thumbs, play on the phone kind of waiting. But there is another kind of waiting, the active waiting of transformation. This is the wait of the woman who has just found out she is going to be a mother. The baby won't be here for months, but the wait won't be an idle one. Preparations need to be made, and throughout this wait there is vital transformation happening.

This pregnant waiting is the wait of Advent. We start our liturgical year watching and preparing for the new thing that is coming. Advent calls us to step back from fast results and glitzy certainty—to turn back to expectant and transforming waiting. We are called, this season especially, to keep awake and alert to the new things that God is doing in our world.

How will you prepare your heart and this world for Christ's coming kingdom this season? If you need a place to start, grab a daily devotional from the commons. Make plans to join us for worship each Sunday and Wednesday evening as we gather around the Word of God. The hope we cling to as the days turn short and cold is that Jesus, the light of the world, is coming. Let every heart prepare him room.

Here are some highlights from our November 2021 Zoom meetings:

- We're getting closer to having the fence installed for CW Avery Learning Center.
- **Motion passed:** The Finance Team moves to present the St. Mark's Lutheran Church 2022 operating budget to the congregation for approval.
- Slate of 2022 Council nominees: Bryan Short, Bonnie Morris, Jason Jones, Anne Blackwell, and Jeremy Kemper (filling open position) have agreed to serve on Council. **Motion passed:** The Executive Team moves to present the above slate of Council nominees to the congregation for approval.
- Slate of 2022 Endowment Fund nominees: Eric Van Tassel and Sarah Volk have agreed to serve on the Endowment Fund Board. **Motion passed:** The Executive Team moves to present the above slate of Endowment Fund Board nominees to the congregation for approval.
- Lutheran Services Carolinas has been approved to host an Afghan Placement Assistance Site that will serve as an Employment Placement and Case Management site. LSC has been in conversation with Pastor Matt about using 2 classrooms at St. Mark's. Now that they have approval, things will move quickly and they are planning to be up and running by Christmas. We are not looking to make money off of this, but LSC did offer \$250/month as a donation. We ARE looking to house them long term and live out our faith by welcoming the stranger. Praise God! Motion passed: Pr Matt moves to accept the Memorandum of Understanding with Lutheran Services Carolina.
- The annual congregation meeting is scheduled for the first Sunday in December, 12/05, at 9:45 AM. It will be a hybrid meeting.


