A Lenten Invitation

I know we are still a month out, but before you know it, Ash Wednesday will be upon us. I know, I know-- we just got done with Christmas! And there are WEEKS left until we move into Lent and start a new season of the church year.

But this season of repentance, that is, turning and returning to the Lord our God, takes some preparation. Kind of like slowing down while driving before you make a U-turn – it's important to observe your surroundings, assess the situation, and make a plan to go in a new direction.



The season of Lent is a time when we draw closer to God through practices that help us to focus on God in a new way in our lives. Often, people will take on Lenten disciplines, practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, that set their attention on God's love and mercy shown to us in Christ. With these new or renewed practices, God sends us in a new direction as we journey to the cross of Good Friday, and the empty tomb of Easter morning.

What would it look like if we took on a Lenten discipline together this year?

What if we took on a practice that would strengthen us, as individuals and as a congregation? An activity that would help us grow in faith and understanding of who God created us to be? An opportunity to strengthen relationships with one another, and build a stronger community that has been difficult to do during the pandemic?

Pastor Matt and I invite YOU to participate in a small group this Lent! Yes, if you're reading this, YOU are invited. It is our hope to have everyone in our community of faith participate in this Lenten discipline together.

What is a small group?

For 6 Sundays, March 6 through April 10, 7 or 8 people will gather, either at church on Sunday during the Faith Formation hour, or on Zoom throughout the week. For about 45 minutes to an hour these Small Groups will read scripture, discuss a weekly topic, get to know one another better through conversation, and pray with one another. Groups will be led by members of St. Mark's, and all groups, whether online or in person, will have discussion material that supports our Lenten theme of "From Everlasting to Everlasting." It is our hope that those who join a small group would commit to attending each of the 6 weeks.

St. Mark's in the LSC News

When St. Mark's Lutheran Church in Asheville conducted its capital campaign a few years ago, Pastor Matt Smith said a big part of it was to renovate the building to serve the community and to plan for a miracle.

“We didn't know exactly what that would look like and what the needs would be, but we trusted that the Spirit would find ways for us to serve through our investment in these spaces,” Smith said.

The campaign allowed St. Mark's to create two classrooms for a child development center, add office space, and renovate some bathrooms. However, Smith said as the COVID-19 pandemic slogged on, the spaces weren't being utilized to their full potential.

When the church received a call from Lutheran Services Carolinas (LSC), the congregation knew it had found the miracle.

“When we got the call from LSC that they were looking at doing refugee resettlement in Asheville and one of the needs was office space, we saw God at work,” Smith said. “Part of our congregation's mission is serving all people, so we were thrilled to be able to use our comfortable spaces to partner with LSC's Afghan placement program to support people who have been through so much and will arrive with so little.”



New American Program Offices Cont.

LSC recently opened a New Americans Program office in part of the church's renovated spaces to bring its refugee resettlement work to the Asheville area. Refugees resettled through LSC are legal, fully vetted, and are here at the invitation of the United States of America.

"We are the church together," said LSC President Ted Goins. "It takes a village and when churches, LSC, individuals, and the Asheville community lean in, we can work wonders. These neighbors have been persecuted and threatened by the Taliban; we can give them a new and safe life as New Americans."

Laura Collins, Asheville's area manager, said LSC expects to receive 100 refugees to the area in the coming months. She added that St. Mark's is a perfect central location for these new arrivals, with easy access to anything they will need.

"I'm excited to be a part of this moment in history," Collins said. "This is quite literally the largest airlift of refugees in United States history, so Asheville gets to be part of that."

The first refugees are set to start arriving in the middle of January, and Collins said there are a variety of ways the community can get involved. The biggest need is housing, whether temporary or more permanent.

The office will also accept donations of halal appropriate meals because of dietary restrictions or donations to pay for them, grocery store gift cards, or general contributions to allow LSC to do this important work.

- Council members began to brainstorm ideas for St. Mark's for the coming year and beyond.

Christine W. Avery Learning Center Updates



With perseverance, persistence, and patience the childcare center is slowly but surely still on track to open at St. Mark's.

From an outside perspective, the childcare center looks like it should be up and running! The fence is in place and the classrooms are ready for learning minds.

Behind the scenes, there are ongoing inspections required by the NC Childcare License Agency—some of which may take 4-6 weeks to complete.

In the meantime, St. Mark's is working to practice the new regulations that will need to be continuously in place in order for CWA to pass inspections before, and during our partnership.

Currently please:

- Keep the door to the education wing locked at all times. There is a key hanging on the bulletin board to the right of the door if you need to get in. Please remember to lock the door behind you each time you pass through.
- Be mindful of what is being left in the kitchen, on the counters or underneath. There can not be any products that say "keep out of reach of children" in the licensed area—and the kitchen will be licensed.

Be on the lookout for additional signs and communications as these regulations may change as we continue the inspection process with CWA. Note that currently, the kitchen can still be used freely while paying attention to the posted regulations. When time gets closer, the kitchen will be off limits from 10:30am-12:30pm Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday.

Security System is LIVE

As a reminder, the security system at St. Mark's is active. This system will monitor the second level of our facility, just as the old system did. Once you come up any stairwell, or enter in the North Liberty St. entrance, the alarm will activate and you have 60 seconds to enter in the code on one of the two keypads. If you remain on the main floor (Fellowship Hall, Kitchen, ect) you will *not* need to deactivate the alarm system.

The code for the new system will be the same code as before. The disarming key pads are located next to the elevator on the second floor and at the end of the admin office hallway. If you need access to this code, or a lesson on how to disarm the system, please contact the church office or Steve.

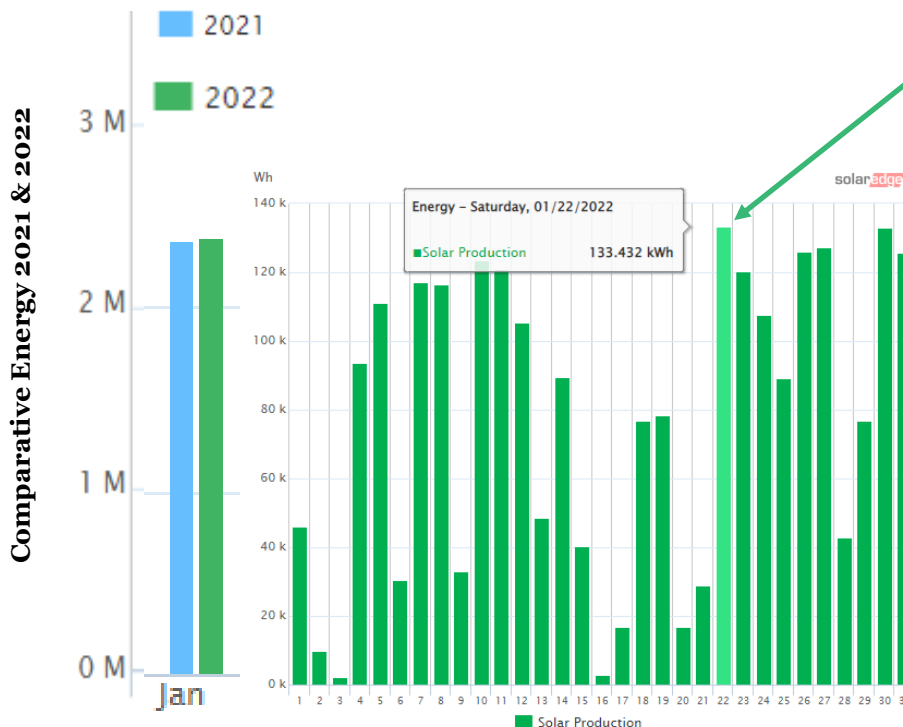
