Dwelling in Christ

Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God. –Colossians 3:16



What do you have memorized? Some people can name all 50 states at the drop of a hat. Some know the books of the Bible from Genesis to Revelation. Others remember the phone numbers of all their friends and family (a rarity now). My grandmother could quote Longfellow and the New Testament with equal ease.

Our world increasingly discourages memorization. It's too difficult, something done in the dark days before the internet, and just vain repetition anyway. But, what better way to let the word of Christ dwell in us richly than through memorization? When a verse is memorized, it becomes a part of us. No books or phones are needed. A solitary walk in the woods can be a moment to sing "Holy, Holy, Holy," rejoicing in God's magnificent creation. Cooking dinner turns into an occasion to meditate on the providence of God while singing "This is the feast." Driving becomes a time to pray for God's beloved child who has tailgated you all the way from Swannanoa by singing "Children of the Heavenly Father." And of course, the shower is prime time for any song remotely related to baptism. I bet when you pray the Lord's Prayer, you already pray it without a book or bulletin! Through memorization the words of Christ dwell in you, and you are freed to make them your own.

If memorization seems daunting, start small. Try singing a simple, rhyming hymn like "Praise God from Whom All Blessings Flow," morning and evening, gradually decreasing your reliance on the printed page. Alternately, set aside fifteen minutes and repeat a section as many times as possible; switch between singing it from the page and closing your eyes and repeating it. Or, pick a single line and carry it with you through the day. Repeat it every hour on the hour, whenever you stand up, or whenever you sit down. The next day, add another line.

When Paul was in a Philippian prison cell with Silas, they were "praying and singing hymns to God." I suspect their jailors didn't provide them with papyrus hymnals or Power-Point slides on the cell wall. Yet they sang as humans have for thousands of years: from memory. Today, we can follow in the footsteps of our ancestors by memorizing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs. As they were for Paul and Silas, they will be a source of strength and comfort for us in the dungeons of life. What will you memorize?



Greetings from the St Mark's Congregation Council!

Here are some highlights from our March 2022 Zoom meeting:

- We continue to await final inspections before opening the CW Avery Learning Center.
- There has been positive coverage of the work of Lutheran Services of the Carolinas to resettle Afghan refugees and of St. Mark's affiliation with LSC in several news outlets recently.
- Pastor Matt reported that staff evaluations have been completed for the year. All are doing quite well!
- Deacon Katie reported that 80 people signed up for the Lenten small groups.
- Deacon Katie will be coordinating efforts and events to celebrate St. Mark's upcoming centennial celebration in 2023. Anyone interested in working with her in any of a number of ways should contact her.
- The Council voted to endorse a fund-raising effort in 2022-2023 to celebrate our 100th year anniversary.
- The Council also voted to authorize a Vehicle Use Agreement with St. Mary's Episcopal for use of their 12-passenger van by St. Mark's staff, LSC staff, and approved St. Mark's volunteers for transportation of Afghan refugees.

As we see our companion churches working with refugees and internally displaced people in Ukraine, I am incredibly humbled by your outpouring of generosity to make this ministry possible. Because of you, our partners can accompany our siblings in Christ during their hour of greatest need.




