Rally Day 2022

Children often ask questions during Children's sermons that throw me a little off my game. Sometimes the questions are hilariously off topic:



- "Deacon Katie, who's your favorite super hero?"
- "Do you want to know what I ate for breakfast?"
- "Why can't fish live outside of water?"

Sometimes, they ask questions that remind me how important those weekly conversations really are: "I don't know how to do that. Can you show me?"

During a Children's Sermon about baptism a few months ago, I told the children that they could remember their baptism every time they dipped their finger in the water and made the sign of the cross on their forehead. One of St. Mark's little Lutherans interjected, and asked me to show her how. After a simple "watch me" and "do it like this," we prayed and the little ones went back to their seats. It was short, simple interaction, but it's a moment that has stuck with me ever since.

When we baptize and welcome a new member into the body of Christ, we (the people of God at St. Mark's) promise to help and support them in their life with Christ. Whether adults or children, we are called to be examples of faithful living, teachers of the Word, and encouragers on their journey. It is important for children to have mentors and supporters in their life in faith. It's important for them to form relationships and get to know members of their church family. While teaching Sunday School, helping with VBS, or giving Children's Sermons are wonderful ways to do that (and please talk to me if you're interested!), there are so many other ways that we all can support children as they learn and grow in faith.

Rally Day is an excellent opportunity to do just that.

Rally Day is one of four Intergenerational Sunday School sessions we have every year. During the Faith Formation hour, children and adults gather together in the Fellowship Hall to learn and grow together. Yes, it's different than our normal adult classes. But it's so incredibly important for us to spend that time together.

Come, sit next to a child at St. Mark's, and get to know a fellow member of the body of Christ. Come, support a little one as they do activities that help them learn something new about who God is. Come, remind them and be reminded of the great love that God has for all in Christ Jesus. And, if that's something you've never done before, don't hesitate to be like our children, interject, and say, "Deacon Katie, I don't know how do that. Can you show me?" I'd be happy to show you how.

Lutheran Services Carolinas Update

ur partnership with Lutheran Services Carolinas (LSC) continues to be fruitful in our ministry work together, although it looks drastically different than just a few months ago. From January through May, St. Mark's and other Circle of Welcome groups worked to support the resettlement and placement of approximately 90 Afghan refugees in their first 90 days as clients of LSC. Working with families during these few months was considered crisis management as housing was found, language classes were set up, basic needs were supplied, and the new Americans began to get accustomed to life in a new culture.

Now that LSC is no longer in the 90-Day Crisis Support with their clients, and not actively receiving new families, what are the current ins and outs of our St. Mark's office mates?

For starters there are a number of new employees that have joined LSC. Hanna Demarcus is the new Area Director overseeing the six employees that work out of the St. Mark's offices. Hanna has a variety of experience centered around refugees from mentoring, to group counseling, to being a case manager. She has recently relocated to the Asheville area and says she feels like she is on a perpetual vacation, especially as she drives home each afternoon and gets to feel gratitude for the mountains she now lives in. Along with Hanna there are family case managers, an outreach coordinator, employment specialists, and now a school impact case manager working together to create self-reliance for their remaining 60-70 clients – this being ultimate goal for LSC.



To reach this independence, each case worker helps their 20-30 clients create achievable goals and make an action plan to see them through. These goals can range from obtaining a valid NC ID to exploring job opportunities until the client feels fulfilled in order to create job stainability. Sara, the School Impact Case Manager, has been working with families to ensure their children are enrolled in summer camps, childcare, and are ready to start

the school year at the end of the month. By working together, the different case managers are able to help the entire family unit, which is showing to be fruitful in LSC's goal of creating self-reliance and independence.

Lutheran Services Carolinas Update cont.

St. Mark's has watched LSC's New American Program in the Asheville location blossom from an idea to a reality, and there is an abundance of impact still to come.



As there continues to be more resources needed to support refugees from around the world, LSC has applied for additional funding for the Resettlement and Placement Program from the US government. If these funds are approved, then LSC will be able to provide new refugees with their initial 90-day Crisis Support in America once again. This will be

determined in the fall of 2022. Although LSC cannot fully support new refugees until approval, they are still able to make an impact in the Ukrainian refugee community.

According to Hanna, the primary way that Ukrainians are seeking refuge in America in order to receive Immigration Status is by being sponsored by an American. The sponsor accepts responsibility for supporting their sponsee with their basic needs and any travel accommodations needed to travel to America. This process allows the Ukrainian refugees to stay in American for up to two years. During this time, LSC is able to assist with Employment Services as part of their on-going work with the Refugee Resettlement Program. They also make sure that they are on track to receive government resources such as food stamps and Medicare. Currently, LSC has 20-30 clients that fall into this category that they are assisting on a normal basis. LSC has plans to connect with the Ukrainian population on a broader spectrum to make sure it is known that they are able to provide employment and government support resources and assistance.

How can we continue to help? Maintain open arms to our neighbors downstairs and continue to support LSC both within the community and within the walls of the church. LSC has commented that they are touched by the comradery and the busy ins and outs of the week at St. Mark's. Seeing the quilting group, property team, and bridge groups use the space for fellowship provides them a positive culture to work in and creates a warm environment that is contagious for the LSC staff. It feeds their energy to continue to support the New Americans in need.



Rehearsals Resume


September 8, 2022

Attention Thrivent Members

Supporting Wine to Water

If you are a benefit member of Thrivent Financial (if you have either a Thrivent annuity or life insurance), you can apply for two Thrivent action grants per year.



The Thrivent Member Network/Southeast region is partnering with Wine to Water, a Boone, NC, non-profit which impacts communities around the world through clean water. Once your Thrivent action grant is approved, you will receive 3 water filters to be assembled and returned in the preaddressed stamped packaging that is included. The filters are small, have only eight pieces, and are very easy to assemble.

The impact of this program is huge. Wine to Water has already changed over 1.5 million lives in 50 countries. One water filter can provide 10 people with clean water for 10 years. One billion people in the world do not have access to clean drinking water. Unclean water is the #1 killer of children- every 15 seconds a child dies because of a water crisis. Participating in a Wine to Water filter build means helping families, schools, healthcare facilities, women and children in the hardest to reach places have direct access to clean water in their households.

If you are unfamiliar with the Thrivent grant application process, I would be happy to walk you through the steps or provide you with a brief video that tells you exactly how to answer each question to apply for a Wine to Water grant. If you are unsure about assembling the filters, our CAT team will be happy to do it for you.
