100K for St. Mark's 100th Appeal

Our effort to raise \$100,000 to celebrate the 100th anniversary of St. Mark's has been a tremendous success so far, and we have already received over \$90,000! With two months left, we are right on track to make it to our \$100,000 goal by our 100th anniversary on July 15th. Because of your generosity we have *already* been able fund a full house build through Asheville Area Habitat for Humanity (\$55,000) *and already* replaced the stained glass window coverings on the exterior of the sanctuary. Now, because of the generosity of those who have already given and the fact that our windows did need the contingency funds we budgeted, we have an opportunity to make this campaign do *even more*.







Our sanctuary floors have effectively allowed us to (literally) stand in worship and praise for decades, and our pews have supported us as we have heard the word of God proclaimed for generations. But the floors and the pews are showing the wear of the countless feet and decades of use (you try having people sit and stand on you for 30 or 40 years and see how you're holding up). With this appeal we have an excellent opportunity to breath some life back into the pews and floors with new foam and fabric on the pews and a refinishing of the sanctuary floors.



So if you haven't yet, please consider a gift to the St. Mark's 100th appeal so that we can ensure that our sanctuary will continue to be a beautiful, comfortable place of worship for the decades to come. Remember, we hope to have all gifts received by July 15th! Thank you for your generosity that is allowing this work and a full house Habitat build to happen.

Greetings from your Congregational Council. In this year of our congregation's 100th anniversary the Council has discussed and approved several motions that have been presented.

- . In March, the Council approved a resolution proposed by Pastor Matt proposing a change to the NC Synod constitution to make Deacons eligible to serve as conference deans.
- . In April, the Council approved Sharon Herrmann, Dan Dudde and Tom Stewart to serve on the Audit Team which now will be known as the Financial Review Team. A big thank you to all three who have offered their time and talents to this endeavor. Also in April, the Council approved a motion to replace trees that were damaging our parking lot with trees with root systems that would cause less damage to the pavement and curbing system. The Council appreciates the input from members of the Property Team and Steve Henry who did research about the various types of trees that would be less damaging to our parking lot.
- . Also in the coming weeks, Steve will facilitate the refinishing of our Sanctuary floors.

Fresh Change Success




