## We give thanks, O Lord;

You know that overwhelmed, resigned feeling—the one you feel when you think about the enormous needs and complex problems out there that don't have easy solutions? That feeling most often flares up in me when I have a sense that the problems of the world are too big for me to impact by myself and I don't know how to make a difference. Fortunately, God usually sends someone to remind me pretty quickly that I don't have to handle everything by myself. God is at work, and so is the Church, the body of Christ in the world.

Our greater Asheville community has some big needs, but we aren't in this alone either. God is at work, and so is the Church, the body of Christ in the world. And one of the ways God is working in this community is through Asheville Buncombe Community Christian Ministry (ABCCM), a coalition of about 300 congregations addressing poverty, hunger, homelessness and access to health care for the under-served in Buncombe County for more than 50 years. St. Mark's has been a part of this coalition from the beginning, and we continue to be deeply engaged through both budgeted support and the work of volunteers. In fact, in 2022 more than 40 St. Mark's members used their time to support ABCCM's work by making sandwiches, providing meals at the women's shelter, doing inventory in the pharmacy, and helping to assess the needs of people in crisis as intake volunteers.

The needs are big, but so is the response. We're talking more than 30,000 people (1 in 11 Buncombe residents) served in 2022; 300 beds of transitional and permanent supportive housing; life-saving medical care that people can't afford to access anywhere else; thousands of visits to inmates at the jail; and the list goes on. So if you want to be part of making a BIG difference for those in need, engaging with ABCCM is a path to do it. Staff at ABCCM regularly help volunteers find the right fit for their interest, availability, and geography, then train and equip them so they can serve confidently. If you'd like to hear more, contact Dan Dudde and the Christian Action Team (CATs) or Pastor Matt, and we can connect you with some of the 40 folks at St. Mark's who can tell you about their work.

Jesus sends us out to proclaim the good news, feed the hungry, and heal the sick, but we don't do any of that alone. God is with us, and together we have an enormous impact on thousands of lives in this community. I'm grateful for the commitment to service I see at St. Mark's all the time, and I'm grateful for our partnership with ABCCM. We are not in this alone, and together we are making a BIG impact in our community. Thank you for all you do.

Beginning on July 23, John Herrmann will lead a Faith Formation class that will sequel Pastor Matt's very popular class on death and dying. We will focus on the book "Final Gifts" by Maggie Callanan and Patricia Kelly. After observing hundreds of dying people, these two hospice nurses noticed that in many cases, dying people often have something to tell us and give to us—"gifts" as they call them. When someone we love is dying, it's hard to know how to help, and what to do. If we know what to look and listen for, many times a dying person can give us answers as to not only how *their* final days could be made more peaceful, but also how *they* can comfort *us* during this stressful time.

Highlights of the book, including many real-life examples, will be examined, so it is not imperative to purchase or read beforehand.







The past twelve months were full of new and unanticipated challenges for Warren and me. I am grateful for the many kindnesses extended to us by the gracious and generous people of St. Mark's - cards, visits, kind words, prayers. The quilters welcomed Warren with open arms when I no longer felt comfortable leaving him home alone on Tuesday mornings. Judy McKay shared her wisdom and support along the way, having experienced a similar path with Henry. The challenges accelerated dramatically when Warren was hospitalized in December, and then went to Aston Park for physical therapy and rehab. He ultimately remained in that excellent facility in skilled nursing for three months.

I especially appreciated Pastor Matt's presence and comfort on the morning of his unexpected death in March. I am grateful for the guidance and support of Pastor, Danielle, Cantor David and Deacon Katie in preparing and carrying out his memorial service on June 6. I have felt completely wrapped in the love of God throughout these months thanks to the wonderful people of St. Mark's.

Thank you to all who came to the memorial service, and all who provided food, set up and generously worked in the kitchen during the reception following the memorial service. Family and friends from around the country appreciated your gracious hospitality.

When Warren and I did our end of life planning "Five Wishes" documents in 2014, I wrote out the plans for my memorial service in great detail. Warren wrote nothing, and never stated any particular wishes. So. . . he got MY funeral, and I got to experience it while living. It was a beautiful service full of meaning and links to our story with special music from the memorial services of each of our parents. Thank you to all who supported my family and me as we worshiped God and remembered the life of my good and kind husband.
