


Advent Worship and Christmas Resources

St. Mark's Online Photo Directory

Just as the leaves and time change every fall, this is a good time to review your entry in the St. Mark's online photo directory for any changes you'd like to make. Having an up-to-date directory is important for all of us to stay connected with each other. You can find photos and contact information for many members there.

To get the online directory, go to the St. Mark's Lutheran home page (www.stmarkslutheran.net) and look in the lower righthand corner, under "Connect." Click on "Online Directory". You'll see a log-in page, asking for a user name and password. Your user name is likely your "firstnamelastname" or "FirstnameLastname" (without the quote marks and no spaces or punctuation). If you've forgotten your password, click on "Forgot password?". You'll be taken to a box, asking for your email and user name. Then you'll get an email with directions on resetting your password. If you've forgotten your user name, please contact Linda Kinsinger (lkinsinger@mac.com) and she can help you.

Once you're in to the directory, you can add or change any contact information you'd like. You can also add or change your photo. If you have trouble uploading a picture, please let Linda know and she will try to help. The picture doesn't have to be anything formal – a selfie taken with your phone is fine. Don't forget to click on "Update" to save any changes you've made. Note that there's both a family account and an individual member account.

You may have questions about the security of this site. You can find the privacy policy on the sign-in page, at the bottom of the sign-in box. Your information is encrypted and the company does not sell any personal data to third parties. You won't get ads from having an account. You control how much or little information is displayed. As always, it's a good idea to change your password regularly or if you have any concerns about security.

If you'd like to have access to the directory on your mobile phone or other device, there is an app available for download from the app store you use. Search for "CTRN Online Directory" and use this privacy code: STMARKSLUTHERAN.

ALMOST A MILLION DOLLARS!

After the 2022 Crop Hunger Walk, the local Asheville/Buncombe Walk, which has been operating since 1979, had raised \$973,805.00. Now, after this year's walk, our total is \$998,000.00---Two thousand short of One Million Dollars!



This year's Hunger Walk, with your support, raised over \$25,200. **St. Mark's alone raised over \$10,000**. Thank you! Approximately 175 walkers participated in this year's walk. They came from eleven groups (mostly churches). We estimate that 35 of these walkers came from St. Marks. Thanks for your generosity!

We're excited at the thought that after next year's 2024 Walk, the Asheville/Buncombe Walk will have surpassed that Million Dollar mark. We hope you will participate again next year.

In February of 2022, St. Mark's partnered with Lutheran Services Carolinas to welcome and support an Afghan family of 10 arriving in the Asheville area. The Ihsas family was part of the nearly 100,000 Afghans who made it to the U.S. after the American withdrawal from Afghanistan and immediate Taliban takeover. Abdul Ihsas, an Afghan television and print journalist, was a target for the Taliban because of his role as a communication conduit between U.S. special forces and the Afghan people. After several months of loving support from St. Mark's, the Ihsas family was able to relocate to Northern Virginia where there is a sizable Afghan community. A member of St. Mark's recently caught up with the family and shared with us about the dire situation Abdul's brother continues to face in Afghanistan as he continues to face persecution from the Taliban because he is Abdul's brother. With some remaining funds that had originally been contributed to support the Ihsas family, St. Mark's was able to send a check to the Ihsas family in Virginia so that they had enough to share some funds to help Abdul's brother in Afghanistan feed his family.

Thank you all for the outpouring of love and prayer for my family and me over the past two months. All of us are turning new and hopeful corners. Seven year old Madalyn is back in school and happy. Granddaughter Emma and wife Chrissie are starting up their business on a small scale, pushing through. We are all missing Mike, but he was a giver and a man of faith so we know he is in God's good hands. God bless you for the cards, prayers, donations and care.


