Rituals of Light and Hope

When daylight saving time ends each fall, it's always jarring. I've got no complaints about the extra hour of sleep on a Saturday night, but I'm always shocked by how early it gets dark. It's not like this is a new phenomenon—I've lived through the fall clock change a few dozen times before. But I'm never ready for the day when I get home from work and it's already getting dark. In fact, we're almost a month beyond the time change, and I'm still not acclimated. And how could I be? Each day is shorter than the one before. Gone are the after dinner walks, outside chores, and playtime with the kids. It's just too dark.

But we know this season of shortening days will not last. In just a few weeks, the trends will reverse and the days will start getting longer and longer. Light and life will make a comeback in our neighborhoods and in our world. And in the meantime, the season of Advent (at least in the Northern Hemisphere) synchs perfectly with our experience.

In Advent we wait for what is coming. We hope in what is not here yet, but what we know is on the way: Jesus. Jesus is coming to bring in the kingdom of God. And that means that the experience we have of the world right now—the brokenness, suffering, and death—they will not last. Because the incarnate God has defeated them and judges them not worthy of the kingdom. This is the source of our hope and our joy in this season, that Jesus will restore all creation.



If you're like me and need that hope to have a prominent place in your life, put some intentionality behind your Advent practices this year. Make daily Advent devotions (available in the commons) part of your ritual. As you do, light your Advent wreath at home (ask Deacon Katie if you need one). Make plans to worship with the St. Mark's community on Sunday mornings and Wednesday evenings. We're grateful to once again join with our ecumenical partners at St. Eugene Catholic, St. Paul's Methodist, and St. Mary's Episcopal for those Wednesday night services—a beacon of cooperation and relationship

in our increasingly disconnected world. Will you join us in these rituals of light and hope in these days where the darkness grows long?

Jesus, the light and life of all people is coming.

The light shines in the darkness. And the darkness has not overcome it.

Thanks be to God.

Advent Devotionals, Wreaths, and Children's Bags


